### FROM THE **PASTOR'S DESK**

Dear church family,

Happy spring! This is, hands-down, my favorite time of year. I used to like autumn the most, but ever since moving to the mountains nearly eight years ago, I prefer spring. The flowers in bloom, the birds chirping and bees buzzing, and the mountains greening up all around us serve as a reminder of Easter and the hope we have in Jesus' resurrection.

Spring is also a time when we get work done. After months of hibernation, we emerge to tackle jobs that might have been neglected in the wintertime. We clean out our houses, fix up our yards, and tend to our gardens. Some folks get back to the golf course or tennis court; others spend Saturdays on the soccer or baseball fields with their young ones. We join the rest of God's creatures in enjoying and cultivating God's creation in its many forms.

And this is certainly true around the church. April 9 marks the beginning of the season of Easter (also called Eastertide), which leads all the way to Pentecost on May 28. This is a time where we "practice resurrection,"



#### **DOLLARS & CENTS**

There are a lot of similarities between church finances and personal finances. There are the bills that must be paid right away, such as Board of Pension dues or our rent or mortgage at home. There are those bills that are due quarterly, such as homeowners' insurance or lawn care. And there are bills that are unexpectedly high, such as the water bill after the pipe freezes or the electric bill after a cold snap. All of this can build into a cash flow event. Last week, I had to use money from our contingency fund to process the payroll. While I am glad we can use that fund when we need it, I get nervous doing it. And I hope we eventually will be able to pay it back.

A big difference between church finances and personal finances is how we get our income. Whereas we know what our paycheck or Social Security check is going to be, we do not have a firm monthly income figure for the church.

Our Finance Committee will be studying our fiscal policies and health, and giving some suggestions of ways we can ease the pinch. In the meantime, please pray about what you give, thanking God always for our church facilities, our staff, and especially the wonderful community we enjoy.

#### SESSION UPDATE

One of many expenditures the Session approved at its March meeting was the "raising of the canopy" of the trees along Grindstaff Cove Road. This label for the trimming of the trees somehow seems an appropriate metaphor for Holy Week. James Walawender had led us in a devotion from a chapter in Peter Scazzero's *Emotionally Healthy Spirituality* that focused on us renewing our true selves by paying attention to our interior in silence and solitude, moving out of our comfort zones, and praying for the courage to do so. The sequence of celebrations of Last Supper, Crucifixion, and Resurrection during Holy Week involves a kind of raising of our personal canopies, opening room for new growth.

In addition to the funds for canopy raising, already available in the landscaping budget, the Session approved the purchase of new seating for the balcony from available funds. Low bids for new flooring, interior painting, and repair of the front door were approved. The repairs will be carried out when funds become available.

In other session news, the new hymnals have arrived. There will be a service of dedication in May. And the session meeting for April was moved from April 10 to April 17.

#### **DEACON UPDATE**

I often look to nature for inspiration, for faith, but I look to my garden this morning after cutting the first asparagus spears of the season. Of course, spring is generally a time of planting and renewal in the garden, but no crop illustrates resurrection quite like asparagus. Unlike most vegetables, it is perennial. Each plant grows again year after year following winter dormancy, bright green shoots erupting from the earth and reaching toward the sky. Then almost as soon as the shoots emerge we harvest them, cutting them back to the ground for our tables. The bed again appears lifeless. But defying its apparent death, the wonder of asparagus is that just days later a new shoot appears.

A wonder of our church is its generosity. You stepped up for the children of the Black Mountain Home. All 47 of the children will receive Easter baskets thanks to you. These baskets, filled with treats selected for each child, are a reminder to the children that they are loved.

Other upcoming deacon projects are study bags for college students, Mother's Day flowers, and a spring hike in early May (date TBD).

#### Cove Cleanup (Roadside Trash Pickup):

Thanks to our Trash Team including Tom Tabor, Bruce Henderson, Larry Selby and Lynda Parlett, we picked up 5 partial bags of trash from Grindstaff Cove Road on March 25. Picking up the plastic straws and eating utensils, drink cans and bottles, food wrappers and containers and other litter prevented that much from getting into Scotts Creek, our water system and into our wildlife! You can see in these pictures that it's very easy for these things to wash into culverts and on into Scotts Creek.

#### **God's Creatures and Creation:**

Did you know that Saturday, April 22 is **Earth Day**? It is a day observed around the world to draw attention to the environment and our impact upon it. God created our beautiful Earth and all of its creatures whether two legged or four legged, finned, feathered or furred, and He gave <u>US</u> the duty to cherish and maintain His creation. When our teams participate in Cove Cleanups, it's easy to see through all of the trash we collect that humans have been failing in that duty. But it's not just here in Jackson County. The average U.S. citizen's carbon footprint (the amount of methane and carbon dioxide humans create) is about four times larger than the rest of the world's! It's so easy to carry on day-to-day without thinking about the environment such as when we toss plastic packaging into the garbage but think about this... nearly 400 million tons of plastic- half of which is single-use products- are produced worldwide each year to meet consumer demands.

According to an abundance of research, not only does the manufacturing process create harmful emissions (carbon footprints), the plastics will eventually break down into micro plastics (tiny particles) that wreak havoc on the environment and wildlife. Just do a search online for the pictures of the islands of plastic waste floating in our oceans or the photos of the dolphins, whales and other marine life that ingest or get caught by these products. Plastics also contain chemicals that can disrupt the human endocrine system as we're chronically exposed to them. What is that doing to our health?

On this Earth Day, think about changing just a few habits to positively impact the planet on which we're so fortunate to live. What about gradually changing from plastic storage containers to glass? (Yes, what was old is now new again!) What about taking your own reusable shopping bags to the store, or asking for paper bags instead?

What about using refillable containers for cleaning products and using environmentally friendly clothes washing detergents and dish detergents so you're not putting so many chemicals into the groundwater? What about composting your food waste? What about making your purchases from companies that have sustainable practices? And, how about doing your shopping locally so you're not only reducing your automobile emissions (or those of the online companies shipping your purchases to you) but also supporting our local business owners and economy?

We hope you'll celebrate this Earth Day with us and make every day a celebration of the Lord's creation.

The Presbyterian Women's Circle met on our usual third Thursday of the month to continue our study of Celebrating Sabbath. This month we discussed "Sabbath and Self-Care."
