# PASTOR'S NOTES

Dear church family,

This is my favorite time of year. Eastertide. Springtime. The season when the days are getting longer and warmer and members of our community emerge from their homes like bears from their caves to stretch their legs and plant



their gardens and turn their faces once more towards the sun. Indeed, resurrection is the name of the game.

And this is certainly true around the church. Not that we were dormant during the wintertime (our church calendar definitely said otherwise) – but we are entering this season with renewed energy and addressing some projects that have long been in the queue. Here are some examples:

**Worship & Discipleship.** We are so grateful to have a thriving music and Christian education program. Courtney and Margaret are doing a fantastic job with the choir on Sundays, our two adult Sunday School classes are bursting at the seams, and Heather, Lilly, and their faithful team of volunteers are leading our children with creativity and love. Since the 2<sup>nd</sup> greatest commandment – and part of our mission statement – is to "love our neighbors as we love ourselves," we want to be intentional about doing just that. One such opportunity is our upcoming Yard Sale on April 6 to benefit The Community Table, our literal neighbor down the street. We

encourage you to bring your donations and come to show your support, and to be on the lookout for other possibilities in the future.



Though only Christ can truly conquer death, the quick green-up once moisture returns looks all the world like a resurrection.

# PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN

In our March monthly meeting, we discussed the life-changing encounter the Ethiopian eunuch had with the apostle Philip in the book of Acts. Led by the Holy Spirit, Philip was prompted to walk on the road from Jerusalem to Gaza, where he met a man from Ethiopia, the African region which was then "the ends of the earth". This man was reading from the scroll of Isaiah but had no idea of the meaning behind the message. Through the Spirit's prompting, Philip was able to share the Good News and the man was overjoyed to be baptized and carry the message of Jesus back to Ethiopia. This is a story of the first global expansion of the gospel through personal witness, to the ends of the earth, that blurs all gender, ethnic and status boundaries. It is also a reminder that knowing the Word of God is an essential

tool for expanding the Kingdom.




