DOLLARS & CENTS

The Session has called a congregational meeting for December 10th for the purpose of presenting the 2024 budget which has been approved by the Session, and for having church members vote on the Pastor's Terms of Call. What do we mean by Terms of Call? Most of us have held jobs and are familiar with the process of interviews, personnel committees, background checks, basic salary information, W-4 forms, etc. A pastor is called to serve a church, not simply hired. Thus, his total compensation package is called Terms of Call. The presbytery has minimum requirements and our Terms of Call are examined each year by the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry to make sure these minimums are met. Other items such as vacation, continuing education, professional allowance, etc. are also spelled out. Every time there is a change such as a raise in cash salary or an addition such as offered sabbatical leave, the congregation must give their approval. The Board of Pensions sets the amounts for Annuity, Medical Benefits, and Insurance as a percentage of Effective Salary (cash salary plus housing allowance.)

I hope and pray that you will attend the meeting and support next year's budget with your continued giving.

SESSION

At the annual Congregation Meeting on December 10, as Clerk of Session, I will report on a proposed change to the Call to the Pastor. Early this year, I received a letter from the Presbytery indicating that our Session needed to review its Call to the Pastor to see that it includes a statement about the availability of sabbatical leaves for the pastor. An elaborate set of sabbatical guidelines was included. I brought the letter and guidelines to a Session meeting where we had an extensive discussion and unanimously approved a motion to develop a sabbatical policy. The matter was referred to the Personnel Committee. They returned the following policy, consistent with Presbytery guidelines, in the form of a motion that was unanimously approved at the Session's regular meeting in October:

A pastor who has been employed for six years is eligible for up to a 12-week sabbatical. It is to be approved and planned in consultation with the Session not less than six months prior to the requested time.

The general tenor of the Session's discussions has focused on the positive potential of sabbaticals for both the pastor and our church. For the pastor, a sabbatical provides for a period of study, learning, and renewal. A sabbatical is not a vacation. The pastor designs a specific project or course of study, approved by the Session. The longer a pastor has been away from their seminary training, the more they need a mechanism for renewing their knowledge and skills. One way pastors experience renewal is by moving to a new position at another church. We hope that a sabbatical will increase the likelihood that our pastor will stay with us, bringing back new energy and new knowledge.

The reason for the 6-month planning period is so the pastor can schedule replacements for leading Sunday services and to find other pastors who can serve communion, conduct baptisms, wedding, and funerals as needed, moderate Session meetings, and provide pastoral care during the sabbatical period. The Worship Committee has included a larger than normal budget for pulpit supply in next year's budget in case of need. However, the Session is optimistic that we can find volunteer Sunday leadership from our church's large body of ordained ruling elders and

mission partners. We expect the Presbytery to offer help with the more formal functions.




UCM Holiday Food Bags for Jackson County Children:


