FROM THE **PASTOR'S DESK**

Dear church family,

I'll admit it: I like the end of December and the beginning of January more than any other time in the winter season. It has a "calm after the storm" quality to it. Candles have been lit, presents have been opened, cookies have been eaten, and – though it's likely a mess from all the hustle and bustle – our house (and the church) feels lived-in and enjoyed, allowing for a time of rest and celebration.

I find the lyrics of "O Holy Night" have special meaning for me this year:

Long lay the world in sin and error pining,
'Till he appeared and the soul felt its worth.
A thrill of hope the weary world rejoices,
For yonder breaks a new and glorious morn.

A new and glorious morn, indeed! Because of Christmas, the light has come. Because of Christmas, we know God has descended to us (rather than waiting for us to ascend to him), revealing himself in Jesus, *Emmanuel*, and promising to be with us always. 

It is time to put a brand new approved budget into the computer, crank out the 2022 contribution receipts, and work on last year's W-2s for the staff and 1099s for the contracted workers. If you were at the Congregational Meeting on December 18th, you will have the 2023 budget in hand. (I have extra copies in my office, available upon request.) We unanimously approved changes to Blake's Call of the Pastor. If you look closely you will see three additional budget lines, landscape improvements, hand bell expenses, and repairs to the transition house. Many lines were lowered but all staff received an 8% cost of living raise. I hope you will consider increasing your giving as you are led and you are able and including our church community in your daily prayers. We finished the year in good shape thanks to some generous end of year gifts. Thank you so much for your faithfulness.

SESSION UPDATE

It was a quiet December session meeting. The highlight was the review of service by the two elders rotating off after their most recent six-year terms, David Noland and Roger Murajda. David and Roger served during the difficult period when decisions needed to be made about meeting together or not and about means of taking services online. They will be missed, indeed. The session also completed a few tasks that the denomination's Book of Order requires, including reviewing the records of the diaconate and reviewing the membership roster. Those relatively menial tasks reminded me of several more important things. First, we are not alone in our ministry. The Presbytery provides oversight and accountability that is absent when churches are independent of any denominational framework. Second, we are not alone in our ministry. In addition to the session, we have the diaconate, a hard-working staff, committee members, choir members, Sunday School teachers, and other volunteers who make the church work. Finally, we are not alone in our ministry. Our church directory includes many people who are not members. Yet they contribute to the work of the church in many ways. We are blessed.

The session will meet the second week of 2023 with new members and new enthusiasm. Pray for us.


Hymnal Update

The Worship Committee would like to thank everyone for the feedback you have provided as we have researched newer hymnals that might enrich our worship together. Your thoughts and concerns support our guiding principles that a hymnal must be biblically based, support our reformed tradition of worship, honor the centuries of great hymns that have been foundational to our worship, and include the best of the more recent hymns that can deepen our worship.

We reviewed several hymnals and are excited to report that we have found one which we feel will support our worship for years to come. *Lift Up Your Hearts* is, as the editors write, a collection of hymns that is "biblical, Reformed, balanced and accessible." It contains the hymns we have treasured for generations as well as the best of new hymns, songs from the global church and settings of all the psalms. In addition the hymnal is a rich source of prayers, litanies, scripture readings and creeds that will enhance our worship.

We would like to make a more detailed presentation about the hymnal and encourage you to attend the February 1st Family Night Supper to learn more about *Lift Up Your Hearts*. We think you will agree that the creators of this hymnal succeeded in creating a resource that "is deep enough to give voice to our praises and laments, contain both our sung prayers and God's words to us, and play a significant role in the faith formation of Christians young and old alike." The purchase of new hymnals will be totally supported by donations. Each hymnal will cost \$20 and there will be the opportunity to designate hymnals in honor or memory of loved ones. 
United Christian Ministry Bag Packing
