Happy July everyone! I hope you are all having glorious summer adventures! We are gearing up for our SUMMER MUSIC CAMP for our children's music program! The camp will be **Monday, July 17 through Thursday, July 20 from 5:30-7:00 PM**. This is for ages 4-11 (grades PreK-5th). We will be learning basic music reading, learning songs, and playing handbells (older kids will be doing REAL HANDBELLS!). While we are still resting in our music program, we are excited about a new season of music making coming soon. We would love ANY and ALL to join us for any of the following:

*Church Choir: NO music experience necessary! We will teach you everything you need to know. We meet on Wednesday 7:00-8:15 PM and sing most Sundays for the church service. This is for ages 12 and up. **Choir starts back Wednesday, August 9th**.

*Youth/Adult Handbells: Our handbells will be meeting weekly this year (time and day TBD) and we have practice most weeks at First United Methodist. The only requirement for handbells is that you are able to read music. We play for church 2-3 times per semester and also play for the Christmas program. This is for ages 12 and up. Handbells start back the first week of September.

Mid-summer is when jewelweed typically makes itself known in the wet places in our landscape. More jewel than weed, at least in my estimation, this plant sets out tubular flowers that are beloved by hummingbirds, bees and other pollinators. We have two species: one orange, one yellow. Unlike almost every other showy flower in our flora, jewelweed is an annual. A jewelweed seed grows into a plant that lives only one growing season; its place taken the next season by a successor that must also grow from seed.

Jewelweed relies on its seeds, and the plant does a lot to make sure its seeds spread. It's really quite fun to watch. Each flower becomes a plump green seed, nestled in a pod by the mother plant. In fall, the pods blast the seeds out, launching them through the air to reach fertile ground. It reminds me, a little, of the early church, of the care and spiritual investment Paul puts into each Christian community he seeds. It reminds me too, of how we can transmit the gospel even today — through sustained acts of nurturing, or through dynamic leaps of faith.

We deacons hope to create an atmosphere of fellowship where the gospel can thrive. Come see it at the Fourth of July Cookout! Robby has been hard at work at the culinary star of this year's meal, smoked pork butts! Come for the food – bring a side dish – and stay for the fellowship.


In our June 16th meeting we viewed and discussed a video about a wise and brave woman in 1 Samuel: Abigail. We will continue our summer study of women of the Bible.
